





Notice how the matzah is striped and pierced. Yahshua was crushed, beaten, pierced, tortured, and given over to be hung on the stake, all this in our place. He took our punishment so we didn't have to.

In Mark 8, Yahshua taught His disciples that that He would have to suffer and be killed, but after three days, He would raise to life again!

Yahshua was whipped and nailed to a wooden pole. He took our punishment for us, and because He was the sinless Messiah, His death could restore our relationship with Yahveh. He bought us back from the enemy, haSatan.





Because Pharaoh would not let the children of Israel go, Yahveh brought plagues against the land of Egypt.



The Sea of Reeds



Exodus 14:19-22 And the Angel of the Most High, who went before the camp of Israel, moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud went from before them and stood behind them. So it came between the camp of the Egyptians and the camp of Israel. Thus it was a cloud and darkness to the one, and it gave light by night to the other, so that the one did not come near the other all that night.
Then Moshe stretched out his hand over the sea; and Yahveh caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea into dry land, and the waters were divided. So the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea on the dry ground, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left.





Exodus 12:37 tells us about how many men (not counting women and children) left Egypt. How many were there?


10. Death of the Firstborn







The Passover

Exodus 11:1 And Yahveh said to Moshe, "I will bring one more plague on Pharaoh and on Egypt. Afterward he will let you go from here. When he lets *you* go, he will surely drive you out of here altogether."

That last plague was the death of the firstborn. In order for the Israelites to be saved from that plague, Yahveh instructed them to slay a lamb (or goat) and put the blood on the two sides and at the top of their doors, then to eat that animal for dinner, with unleavened bread and bitter herbs.
